# AFRICA DIALOGUE ON GENDER EQUALITY IN EDUCATION (ED – TALKS)

#### Background

Education is the main driver of development across the globe and thereby considered fundamental to ensure equitable inclusive quality education and lifelong learning opportunities for all. Situational studies and analyses indicate that the majority of those most excluded from human resource development, education, science and technology, are women and girls. Gender Equality and empowerment of girls, women, youth, men and boys remains a critical agenda to the Africa Union and International Community through the Global Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and Agenda 2063.

The Continental Education Strategy for Africa (CESA 16-25) further underscores the principle of gender equity, equality and sensitivity as an anchor for the African Education and Training Systems. The mission of CESA 16-25 sets out to re-orient Africa's Education and Training systems to meet the values, knowledge, competencies, innovation and creativity required from Early Childhood Development through to tertiary level, especially in Technical and Vocational Training (TVET), Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) teaching and learning, and in education management and leadership. Girls and women must have equal access and opportunities to benefit from as well as contribute to this mission.

The Gender Equality Strategy for CESA 16-25 commissioned by Forum for Africa Women Educationalists (FAWE) and the African Union's Centre for the Education of Girls and Women in Africa (AU-CIEFFA) provides a detailed guidance to all AU Member States on mainstreaming and integrating gender perspectives as they implement CESA 16-25. This includes recommending entry points for advancing gender equality and empowerment of girls and women and young people, for all the 12 Strategic Objectives of CESA 16-25. The Gender Equality Strategy for CESA 16-25 further recommends leadership, financing and management arrangements to ensure accountability, integrity and impact.

It is against this backdrop that UNESCO and the Government of Kenya, in collaboration with the African Union, ADEA and the SDG4 co-conveners (ILO, UNDP, UNFPA, UNICEF, UNHCR, UNWOMEN and the WB) will on 25<sup>th</sup> - 27<sup>th</sup> of April 2018 convene a Pan-African High-level Meeting on Education at Safari park Hotel in Nairobi, Kenya. This High level Meeting presents an opportunity to share the lessons learned by member states this far and contribute to the ongoing discussions on the 2063 African Union vision; "The Africa We Want".

In tandem with the continental discussions on Agenda 2063 and the Global Sustainable Development Agenda 2030 with an emphasis on SDG 4, FAWE, AU HRST, UNESCO, People Initiative Foundation in collaboration with UNICEF ESARO/UNGEI, GIZ, Plan International and partners will organize a side event on 25th April 2018, dubbed **AFRICA DIALOGUE ON GENDER EQUALITY IN EDUCATION**, an Educative Talk (ED TALK) platform, at Safari Park Hotel in Nairobi, Kenya. The event will be hosted by youth drawn from different regions in Africa who will engage the key continental leaders and policy makers on the issues surrounding Gender Equality in Africa.

The event will bring together Education experts and policy makers from the African, Africa Ministers of Education and their representatives, youth, private sector, accomplished academics, leaders of civil society organizations and other distinguished individuals to foster productive dialogue around what members need to actualise the implementation of the Gender Equality Strategy (GES) for the Continental Education Strategy for Africa (CESA 16-25).

The theme for the event is *"promoting women and girls education through the implementation of the gender equality strategy for CESA 2016-2025"*. The focus will be on gender equality priority issues such as: Increasing participation and innovation in STEM education, Education in Emergencies / post conflict situations, Education Financing and Out of School Children Education among other areas.

#### **Expected Outcome**

A shared understanding, collective buy in and commitment by AU members states, policy makers and education stakeholders on promoting gender equality and inclusion in education though the implementation of the Gender Equality Strategy for CESA 16-25.

#### **Objectives of the Event**

- 1. Creating awareness among AU member states, policy makers and education stakeholders on how to translate Gender Equality Strategy for CESA 16-25 to action.
- 2. Broader understanding on what has worked in promoting Gender Equality and inclusion in Education in Africa.

#### **Expected outputs**

- 1. A shared understanding about the Gender Equality Strategy and its implications as a guiding framework for the implementation of CESA 16-25.
- 2. Commitment by AU member states, policy makers and education stakeholders to adopt the Gender Equality Strategy for CESA 16-25.

#### **Event Organisation**

The event format will be in three parts. Part one will include a brief introduction to the Gender equality strategy by the AU HRST commissioner H.E Prof. Sarah Anyang Agbor and a youth led ED talk on status of Gender equality in education in Africa; Part two will involve a panel discussion by key education experts from the African Union, Ministries of Education, INGO and regional CSO. The third part will be a networking cocktail for all education stakeholders to create important connections and contacts to enhance gender equality in education in the continent.

The main activities at the event include:

- 1. ED talk by selected speakers
- 2. Panel discussion
- 3. Question and answer session
- 4. Documentation of the key outcomes of the session for follow-up
- 5. Networking
